## Resolution # 01-27-99B 1999 Historic Preservation Fund Grant Proposal

- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of the Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the General Tribal Council has been delegated the authority by Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has determined as part of its Seven Generation Commitment to "revitalize Oneida History, Culture, and Heritage," by developing cultural resources and assuring their accessibility to the Tribal public and others, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Cultural Heritage Department's mission is to educate, protect, maintain and honor our ways, and
- WHEREAS; the Oneida Business Committee passed BC Resolution # 06-10-98A, Adoption of Ordinance for the Protection and Management of Archeological, Cultural, and Historic Resources, and
- WHEREAS, BC Resolution # 06-10-98A, Article VI hereby creates an Oneida Register of Historic or Culturally Significant Resources and Article VIII mandates "the Oneida Cultural Heritage Department, shall identify, document, to the extent appropriate, and preserve all existing burial sites, marked or unmarked, within the Reservation",

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED**, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin authorizes and submits this application to the U.S. Department of the Interior, National Park Service for a 1999 Historic Preservation Fund Grant, to "Locate and Identify Cultural Resources within the exterior boundaries of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin."
