WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin own an undivided 68/120 interest in the Daniel Schanandore allotment with heirs;

Procopia A. Schanandore	26/120 int.

WHEREAS, the land is described as follows;

Lot A, Section 28 and Lot 7, Section 29,
T. 23N., R. 19E., in Outagamie County,
Wisconsin containing 70 acres.

WHEREAS, the heirs have expressed their willingness to convey their interest to the Oneida Tribe based on the most recent appraisal approved on November 23, 1982, as follows;

Edwin V. Schanandore	13/120 = \$6,120.83
Donald L. Schanandore	13/120 = 6,120.83
Procopia A. Schanandore	26/120 = 12,241.66

Totaling - \$24,483.32

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Oneida Business Committee in Special session assembled hereby agrees to deposit \$24,483.32 at the Great Lakes Agency, Ashland, Wisconsin and requests the Superintendent to proceed with processing the documents for the approval and transfer of title to the Oneida Tribe.
