

Resolution No. 3-5-79-A

WHEREAS, the natural world has been a major foundation of the Indian world, and;

WHEREAS, the condition of the natural world has a direct relationship to the conditions of the Indian world, and;

WHEREAS, the Oneida Nation of the Iroquois Confederacy has developed a basic spiritual relationship to the natural world, and;

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs has direct responsibilities to the Indian Community in the areas of Health, Education and Welfare and;

WHEREAS, the Iroquois Communities have had to rely upon the natural world and her resources for our Health, Education, and Welfare, and;

WHEREAS, maximizing the use of resources would benefit both the natural world and the Indian Community.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Oneida Business Committee acting within it's power requests financial and technical assistance from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to generally develop an overall management plan for Tribal resources and specifically to develop a forestry management plan for the Community.
