RESOLUTION NO. 3-11-83-c

WHEREAS: The Indian Self-Determination Act granted Tribes the right to contract for Bureau Programs, and

WHEREAS: The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a Tribe recognized by the United States, and


WHEREAS: The Bureau of Indian Affairs is responsible to assist Tribes in their endeavors,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Business Committee, request a contract from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide funding from BIA unbanded allocations to continue the operation of the Oneida Self-Help Cannery to provide it's services to the economic deprived and members of the Oneida Tribe, and that the Tribal Administrator is authorized to negotiate the contract and any amends thereof, and the Cannery supervisor is authorized to execute the contract and any amends there to,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: The the proposed date will be October 1, 1984 and remain in effect for a period of one-year.
