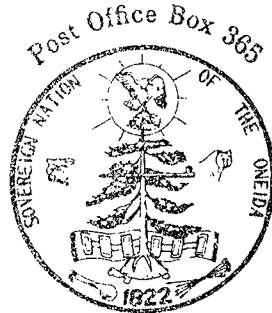


Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

RESOLUTION 3-11-83-J

WHEREAS, The Indian Self Determination Act granted Tribes the right to contract for Bureau Programs, and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a Tribe recognized by the United States, and,

WHEREAS, The Bureau of Indian Affairs is responsible to assist the Tribe in their endeavors,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Business Committee requests a contract from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide funding from unbanded allocations for services to the Elderly.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That contract negotiations, amendments and/or modification be initiated through the Elderly Program Director and the Tribal Administrator who will seek final approval of the Oneida Business Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That all allocations pertaining to this contract be made available Apr. 1, 1983 via Letter of Credit and that the proposed term of the contract commence Oct. 1, 1984 and complete Sept. 30, 1985.
