## RESOLUTION NO. 3-24-82-D

WHEREAS The Indian Self Determination Act granted Tribes the right to contract Bureau Programs, and,

WHEREAS The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a Tribe recognized by the United States, and,

WHEREAS The Bureau of Indian Affairs is responsible to assist Tribes in their endeavors,

NOW HEREBY BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Business Committee request a contract from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to provide funding from unbanded allocations for the construction of a Community Facility.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That contract negotiations, amendments and/or modifications be initiated through the Economic Developer and the Tribal Administrator who will seek final approval of the Oneida Business Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That all allocations pertaining to this contract be made available May 1, 1982 via Letter of Credit and that the proposed term of the contract commence on May 1, 1982 and complete April 30, 1983.
