

## RESOLUTION NO. 3-24-82-I

- WHEREAS The Indian Self-Determination Act granted Tribes the right to contract for Bureau Programs, and,
- WHEREAS The Oneida Tribe of Wisconsin is a Tribe recognized by the United States, and,
- WHEREAS The Bureau of Indian Affairs is responsible to assist Tribes in their endeavor.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Business Committee, request a contract from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to providing special land or reality services from unbanded allocations.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That contract negotiations, amendments and/or modifications be initiated through the Land Coordinator and the Tribal Administrator who will seek final approval of the Oneida Business Committee.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the proposed date will be October 1, 1982 and remain in effect for a period of one year.

### C E R T I F I C A T I O N
