RESOLUTION NO. 5-9-77-A

WHEREAS: The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has retained the Native American Rights Fund to represent all our legal claims, and


WHEREAS: The July 18, 1977, 25 U.S.C. §2415, statute of limitations if not extended, may result in the loss of our claims not promptly prosecuted, and

WHEREAS: Wisconsin land claims represent a significant resource of the Wisconsin Oneidas,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Wisconsin Oneida's retained counsel, the Native American Rights Fund, is directed to present a statement of alternative actions possible with regard to Wisconsin claims to the Oneida Business Committee, and that such statement be presented at the earliest possible date so that the Wisconsin Oneidas may decide on a course of action to best protect our Wisconsin land resources.

CERTIFICATION
