RESOLUTION NO. 6-4-84-A

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has plans to develop a 200 room hotel on lands commonly known as the "airport land"; and

WHEREAS, The Village of Ashwaubenon is agreeable to extending sewer and water lines to the airport land; and,

WHEREAS, The Economic Development Administration has determined it will accept a joint application from the Village of Ashwaubenon and the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin for a \$500,000 grant to construct sewer and water lines to the site.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin be a co-applicant for a grant of \$500,000 from the Economic Development Administration for the sewer and water services to the airport land; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin commit a total of \$349,900 in cash and in kind contributions as matching funds for the \$500,000 grant; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: The Tribal Chairman be authorized to sign all necessary documents relating to the grant application.
