Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.


RESOLUTION # 6-12-96-A

- WHEREAS the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, a national priority of the Oneida Nation is to protect, maintain and improve the standard of living and the environment in which the Oneida people live, and
- EREAS, the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Environmental Department to "effectively promote a respect for our environment using our abilities to plan, educated and regulate with the cooperation of the Oneida community", and
- WHEREAS, the purpose of the Environmental Quality Program is to maintain and improve environmental quality on the reservation in order to protect the people and the natural resources of the Oneida Nation.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submits this application to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency for a Sector-based Multi-Media Grant authorized by the Toxic Substances Control Act.
