Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.


RESOLUTION # 6-28-95-B

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the goal of the Oneida Tribe is to continue to acquire, preserve, protect, and improve the tribal lands and environment, and respond to the needs of our Mother Earth through integrated management, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe through the Oneida Environmental Planning Department and the Oneida Cannery believe that we must respect, honor and care for Mother Earth and her families within the sacred circle of life, nurturing all generations, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe believes it is our privilege and responsibility to protect the land and preserve the environment.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin-Oneida Environmental Planning Department with the support of the Oneida Cannery authorizes and submits this grant application to the Wisconsin Energy Bureau/Department of Administration for the purpose of determining the feasibility of renewable energy options on the Oneida Reservation.
