## RESOLUTION JULY 5, 1967

Therefore Be it Resolved that the act of Norbert Hill in the execution of said amendment of said contract for and on behalf of said Executive Committee and Tribe be and the same hereby is ratified, confirmed and approved that the said amendment of said contract shall stand as if the same had been executed in the name of the Executive Committee of the Tribe.

The above resolution was duly adopted by the Executive Committee of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin by a vote of 3 for and 0 against, a quorum being present, at a meeting of said Committee at Oneida, Wis., on this 5 day of July 67.
