RESOLUTION #GTC 7-6-87-A

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States; and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida General Tribal Council is the governmental body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and,

WHEREAS, It is the goal of the Oneida Tribe to protect, maintain, and improve the standard of living for it's members and the environment in which we live; and,

WHEREAS, Our young people, our youth and our unborn are our most valuable assets; and,

WHEREAS, The leadership of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is endangered by the diminished mental and physical capacities caused by the use and abuse of alcohol and other control drugs; and,

RESOLUTION #GTC 7-6-87-A (Continued)

WHEREAS, Alcohol and other chemical dependencies are the cause of domestic violence, the disintegration of families as well as civil and criminal violations of the law; and,

WHEREAS, Alcohol and other chemical dependencies rank in the top three leading causes of death, by overdose, suicide, or other directly related health problems; and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Public Safety Department is a functional agency of this community, already trained and operational; now,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin immediate priority be for the development and adoption of an Alcohol and Drug Control Ordinance within the original 1838 boundaries and jurisdiction for the preservation of all Tribal members, now and in the future.
