## RESOLUTION # 7-7-93-B

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and

WHEREAS, the safety and welfare of Oneida families is a concern and responsibility of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and


WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has established the Social Services Division to provide services to families including families experiencing domestic violence; and

WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is eligible to apply for and receive grant funds under Title III of the Child Abuse Amendments of 1984 entitled the "Family Violence Prevention and Services Act".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin submits application for assistance under the Family Violence Prevention and Services Act on behalf of the members of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin and designates the Social Services Division responsible for the implementation and coordination of a family violence shelter on the Oneida Reservation.
