RESOLUTION NO. 7-9-85-A

RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDMENT TO THE PRELIMINARY LOAN FOR LOW-RENT PUBLIC HOUSING

- WHEREAS: It is the policy of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin to provide adequate housing on the Oneida Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS: Under the provisions of the United States Housing Act of 1937, as amended, the United States of America, acting through the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development (herein called the "Government"), is authorized to provide financial assistance to local public housing agencies for undertaking and carrying out preliminary planning of low-rent housing projects that will assist in meeting this goal, and
- WHEREAS: The Act provided that there shall be local determination of need for low-rent housing to meet needs not being adequately met by private enterprise for preliminary loans for surveys and planning in respect to any low-rent housing projects unless the governing body of the locality involved has by resolution approved the application of the public housing agency for such preliminary loan, and
- WHEREAS: The Oneida Housing Authority, (herein called the "Local Authority"), is a public housing agency and is applying to the Government for a preliminary loan to cover the costs of surveys and planning in connection with the development of low-rent housing, and
- WHEREAS: The application of the Local Authority to the Government for a preliminary loan was approved on July 15, 1979, in the amount of \$41,705, Program Reservation No. BI39-B010-008, Contract No. C-3045 for surveys and planning in connection with the low-rent housing project, and

WHEREAS: The Oneida Housing Authority has submitted to the Government, a Development Program for construction of fifty low-rent housing units costing \$2,767,000 of which \$339,193 of those funds shall be placed in an escrow account to be used for the construction of the streets, water and sewer portion of this project by the City of Green Bay, Wisconsin, and

WHEREAS: The Oneida Housing Authority and the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin desires to amend the Preliminary Loan to include the amount of \$339,193 for immediate use in constructing the streets, water and sewer portion of the project and that these funds to be placed in an escrow account under the names of the Oneida Housing Authority and the City of Green Bay which will be drawn upon by agreement of the two parties when phases of work have been completed.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee, Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, in session, hereby approves the amendment to the Preliminary Loan in the amount of \$339,193 to be used immediately in constructing the streets, water and sewer portion of the project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the \$339,193 be deposited into an escrow account under the names of the Oneida Housing Authority and City of Green Bay for payment of the streets, water and sewer construction work to be done by the City of Green Bay.
