Because of the help of this Oneida Chief in cementing a friendship between the six nations and the Colony of Pennsylvania, a new nation, the United States, was made possible.


RESOLUTION # 7-9-90-B

- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, Melinda Doxtator has worked for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, sharing her knowledge of the Oneida Language, and
- WHEREAS, Melinda Doxtator as a keeper of the Oneida Language has been committed to teach the Oneida Language to the teachers of the Oneida Language, and
- WHEREAS, Melinda Doxtator has always been available to teach and assist other tribal members in the community the Oneida Language, and
- WHEREAS, Melinda has shown great love, devotion and commitment in sharing her language skills to the children of the Oneida Headstart program throughout the years, and
- WHEREAS, Melinda Doxtator is loved by the community for her caring and sharing.
