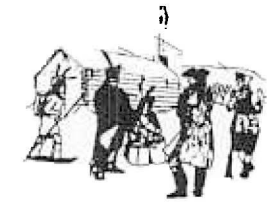

- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business committee has taken the position to acknowledge and honor those who have made great accomplishments;
- WHEREAS, the Oneida business Committee also supports our individuals to be the best they can be, and
- WHEREAS, special recognitions are given to our elders, youth, veterans, and scholars, and
- WHEREAS, through this Resolution, the Oneida business Committee would like to encourage our young people to pursue their dreams and goals in life, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee takes special pride to acknowledge the accomplishments of Conrad King, a young Oneida Tribal member, who through strong determination and hard work developed the ability and skill to fulfill his dreams to compete in local and national golf tournaments; and
- WHEREAS, On August 13, 1994 Conrad King took the championship of the Brown County Amature Golf Tournament that was held at the Brown County Golf Course, of Green Bay, Wisconsin
