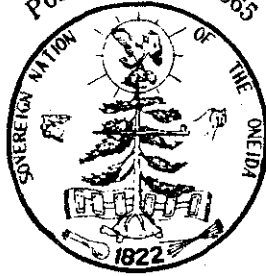

RESOLUTION NO. 8-20-82-B

- WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Tribe governed by its own constitution and by-laws; and,
- WHEREAS, Said Tribe is jointly active in promoting the health, safety and well being of its members, as well as the membership of all other Wisconsin Tribes; and,
- WHEREAS, Said Tribe is pledged to cooperate with all local governments in areas of common concern; and,
- WHEREAS, Wisconsin, including the Oneida Reservation, has the potential for a major mineral mining industry, including radioactive mining by product extraction; and,
- WHEREAS, Such an industry will have substantial impact on the present economy, environment and quality of life of all Wisconsin residents; and,
- WHEREAS, The effects of such an industry will not be limited to the specific mining sites; and,
- WHEREAS, Mining laws are presently being formulated without sufficient knowledge and input from residents of Wisconsin; and,
- WHEREAS, There is concern that presently proposed and enacted laws regarding mining do not adequately protect the present economy, environment, health, safety and welfare of the residents of Wisconsin; and,
- WHEREAS, It is the duty of this Tribe to protect and promote the interests, health, safety and welfare of its members and residents of the community in cooperation with local governments;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:


That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin does hereby promote a moratorium on all metallic mineral exploration, prospecting and mining, until such time that adequate laws exist to protect and promote the interests, health, safety and welfare of its community; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin hereby supports all other Tribes, Towns and Communities in Wisconsin having similar concerns.

C E R T I F I C A T I O N
