Resolution No 9-8-81A

Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

- WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians is a member of the Bay Community and as a member of this community is concerned about the coordination and cooperation of all Bay Community members, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians has a major interest in the utilization of natural resources and a sincere desire to protect such resources, and
- WHEREAS, an organization has been conceived involving Bay Community members in an attempt to lead the community by developing consensus in the wise use of natural resources of the Bay and adjacent land.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Tribe of Indians supports the "Future Of The Bay" organization and will serve as an active participant in such an organization.
