



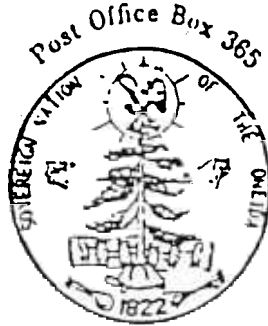
Oneidas bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

RESOLUTION NO. 9-28-84-C

WHEREAS, The Oneida General Tribal Council has duly elected a Business Committee and charged the Committee with responsibilities to develop and govern programs and enterprises that enhance the Tribe's well being in health, education, social and economic development; and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has specifically developed programs at the Oneida Community Health Center that enhance the Oneida Community standards; and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has historically experienced unexceptable rates of tuberculosis within the community, various community members have a history of tuberculosis infection and potential infection exists; and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Community Health Center has available accepted medical capabilities to educate, identify, and place patients in remission.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That all Business Committee members, Tribal employees and volunteer help be required to take a tuberculosis skin test or x-ray to test for active tuberculosis;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That an annual tuberculosis test plan be implemented by the Oneida Community Health Center personnel to insure that all employees and volunteer help of the Oneida Tribe be tested annually for continued employment with the Oneida Tribe.
