RESOLUTION NO. 10-21-83-B


- WHEREAS: It is national policy to provide full Indian participation in the education of Indian people; and,
- WHEREAS: The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is vitally concerned about the education of its youth; and,
- WHEREAS: P. L. 93-638 allows Indian Tribes to enter into a contract to plan, conduct, and administer education programs; and,
- WHEREAS: The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin wishes to continue administering the Tribal School and its ancillary programs, i.e. Chapter I and Special Education, P.L. 142.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED.

That the Tribal Chairman is authorized to sign the necessary contracting documents for FY 1983/1984 School Year.
