

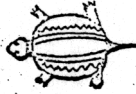
Onoias bringing several hundred bags of corn to Washington's starving army at Valley Forge, after the colonists had consistently refused to aid them.

WHEREAS, THE ONEIDA TRIBE WAS IN ATTENDANCE AND A PARTICIPANT IN THE 1973 N.C.A.I. CONVENTION IN THE CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA,
WHEREAS, THE ONEIDA TRIBE AT SAID CONVENTION WAS NOT INFORMED AND DID NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE ELECTION OF THE CURRENT MINNEAPOLIS AREA VICE PRESIDENT,
WHEREAS, AS THE ONEIDA TRIBE HAD WISHED TO PLACE A CANDIDATE IN NOMINATION,
