RESOLUTION NO. 11-20-84-B

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin has an existing contract for Records Management with the BIA under P.L. 638; and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe's Record Management is presently under a second year of funding from P.L. 638 allocations; and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin wishes to extend the existing efforts in the area of Property Management and Receiving Clerk; and,

WHEREAS, The Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin have agreed to maintain a Property Management and Receiving Clerk once the P.L. 638 eligibility is depleted.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin requests that the Property Management and Receiving Clerk project be funded from P.L. 638.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the Records Management Project run from January 1, 1985 to September 30, 1985.
