Resolution 12-22-82-B

- WHEREAS: The Oneida Tribe of Indians is a federally recognized Tribe and the Oneida Indian Reservation is a federally recognized reservation as established in 1838, and
 - WHEREAS: The Oneida Tribe is active in promoting and protecting the wholesomeness of the reservation environment, and
 - WHEREAS: The Oneida Tribe is pledged to cooperate with all other governmental agencies concerning environmental as well as other areas of common concern, and
 - WHEREAS: Water Resources Management has been a major environmental concern and indeed the focus of tribal efforts to protect and enhance the natural environment, and
 - WHEREAS: The Duck Creek Watershed drains 67.9 percent of the reservation and 44.9 percent of the watershed is within the reservation, and
 - WHEREAS: Major non-point source and point source water quality problems have been identified within the watershed by local, regional, state, and tribal agencies, and
 - WHEREAS: The Oneida Tribe and other governments, have taken initial steps in addressing these water quality problems, and
 - WHEREAS: The Wisconsin Priority Watershed Program would significantly expand the scope of and accelerate the progress made toward limiting non-point source pollution to Green Bay and improving the environmental health of the area, and
 - WHEREAS: The Oneida Indian Reservation is a part of the Fox Valley Water Quality Planning Agency area, and
 - WHEREAS: The Fox Valley Water Quality Planning Agency submits to the Department of Natural Resources for priority watershed selection regional priority watershed choices.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians recommends to the Fox Valley Water Quality Planning Agency Board that the Duck Creek Watershed be selected as a watershed to be submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources for consideration in the priority watershed selection process.
