- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian Government and a Treaty Tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida General Tribal Council is the duly recognized governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section 1 of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Tribe has acquired in fee status the following parcel described as:  
Former Francis R. Skenandore Property
- WHEREAS, the parcel is described as follows:  
Legal Description: See attached.  
Tax Parcel Number: HB-1307-3
- WHEREAS, the above described parcel is requested in Trust Status to expand Oneida Tribal land base and provide an existing residential land use and will not be used for gaming purposes, and
- WHEREAS, the Oneida Business Committee certifies that the local property taxes will be paid up to trust placement,
- NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oneida Business Committee hereby requests that the United States Bureau of Indian Affairs initiate and carry out the process required to place the above parcels in trust for the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin.

Commencing at the intersection of the West line of Section 3 and the centerline of County Trunk Highway J (known formerly as State Trunk Highway 54 and as the public highway between the Green Bay & Western Railroad Depot and the Mission); thence S  $0^{\circ}26'$  E along the West line of Section 3 a distance of 28.87 feet; thence N  $30^{\circ}21'E$  3.75 feet to the South line of County Trunk Highway J; thence S  $59^{\circ}26'E$  279.84 feet along said line; thence S  $56^{\circ}59'20''E$  171.30 feet along said line to a steel pipe, the point of beginning; Thence S  $30^{\circ}34'W$  126.56 feet to a steel pipe in the North line of the right of way of State Trunk Highway 54; thence S  $76^{\circ}00'E$  208.12 feet along said line to a steel pipe in the East line of a parcel of land described in Volume 145 of Deeds, Page 53, Brown County Records; thence N  $30^{\circ}21'E$  62.52 feet along said line to a steel pipe in the South line of County Trunk Highway J; thence N  $59^{\circ}26'W$  89.40 feet along said line; thence N  $56^{\circ}59'20''W$  109.94 feet along said line to the point of beginning.
