RESOLUTION # 6-05-02-A


State of Wisconsin/Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development/Division of Economic Support/Office of Child Care/Community Child Care Initiatives (CCCI)

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States, and
- WHEREAS** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin, and
- WHEREAS** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV, Section of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe has determined as part of its Seventh Generation Commitment, "To develop a provisional system that fits our "family"/community values such as food, shelter, clothing and child care as well as other services," and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe has established the Oneida Social Services/Center for Self-Sufficiency Child Care Program and with a collaborative effort of the Oneida Education and Training/Office of Child Care Programs to promote quality educational and employment support opportunities for all members of the Tribe from early childhood throughout the circle of life, in accordance with Oneida's need for cultural survival and well-being, and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe with the collaboration of the State of Wisconsin/Office of Child Care would like to build the quality, supply and accessibility of child care programs for children in working families.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: That the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin in collaboration with the State of Wisconsin/Department of Workforce Development/Office of Child Care/Community Child Care Initiatives Grants authorizes and submits this grant application for the purpose of securing external monies to expand and improve the quality and quantity of child care services for working families on the Oneida Reservation.
