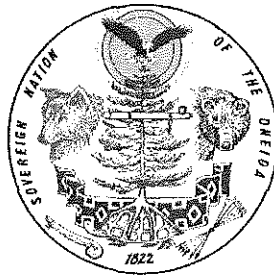


Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin

BC Resolution 01-27-10-B

Amendments to the Alcohol Beverage Licensing Law

- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin is a federally recognized Indian government and a treaty tribe recognized by the laws of the United States of America; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida General Tribal Council is the governing body of the Oneida Tribe of Indians of Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS,** the Oneida Business Committee has been delegated the authority of Article IV of the Oneida Tribal Constitution by the Oneida General Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS,** under federal law, the Tribe is required to abide by state law in order to sell alcohol beverages; and
- WHEREAS,** in order to be consistent with state law, the Tribe's current Alcohol Beverage Licensing law (Law) requires that an application for a tribal license to sell alcohol include a copy of a license issued by a municipality to sell alcohol beverages; and
- WHEREAS,** the recently passed state budget includes amendments to Wisconsin law which allow the Tribe or "any business entity that is wholly owned and operated" by the Tribe to receive a permit from a municipality or the Wisconsin Department of Revenue to sell alcohol beverages; and
- WHEREAS,** amendments to the Law will allow a tribal license to be issued when the applicant produces a license from a municipality or the Wisconsin Department of Revenue; and
- WHEREAS,** a public hearing was held on December 8, 2009 in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the attached amendments to the Alcohol Beverage Licensing law are hereby adopted.
